Peter K. Smith

Peter K. Smith is Professor of Psychology and Head of the Unit for School and Family Studies at Goldsmiths College, University of London. His research interests are in social development, school bullying, play, grandparenting, and evolutionary theory. He is co-author of *Understanding Children's Development* (Blackwells, 2003), and co-editor of *The Nature of School Bullying* (Routledge, 1999), *The Family System Test* (Routledge, 2001) and the *Blackwell Handbook of Childhood Social Development* (Blackwell, 2002) and editor of *Violence in Schools: The Response in Europe* (Routledge, 2002). He is co-editor of *Bullying in Schools: How Successful can Interventions be?* (Cambridge University Press, 2004) co-author of *The nature of play: Great apes and humans* (Guilford Publications, 2005), and author of *Children and Play* (Wiley-Blackwell, 2009).

Manjula Waniganayake

Dr Waniganayake is an Associate Professor, at the Institute of Early Childhood, at Macquarie University in Sydney, Australia. She is specialist in early childhood policy and leadership matters with a particular focus on cross-cultural perspectives. Dr Waniganayake has a strong knowledge base about early childhood services built through research and active involvements with key stakeholder organizations in the early childhood field spanning some 20 years of voluntary work.
